9. Moved to Hollywood later in life & began an affair w/ Sheila Graham	9. Began a novel called The Last Tycoon, but died before it was finished.	9. Enjoyed writing & painting to fill her days. Wrote a novel, eleven short stories & 12 articles. Painted numerous artistic works.
10. Died from heart failure in 1940 at the age of 44.	10. He never knew the success Gatsby became. It didn't become popular until WWII.	10. Died in a hospital fire in 1948 in Asheville, NC
